

The Foundation is delighted to present the 2016 Pendle Award for Philanthropy to Winston Meyer. This fund made it possible for the Community Foundation of Mississauga to provide grants to locally-led projects that build community, inspire a deeper understanding of Canada and encourage participation in a wide range of initiatives that mark Canada's 150th anniversary of Confederation. Thanks to support from our donors to the Pendle Fund, the Meyer Family Fund and the Wordham Family Fund, we are able to grant \$160k to fifteen projects that will inspire and ignite Mississauga residents in celebrating our heritage.

The Mississauga Heritage Foundation is receiving a grant to develop a series of short videos which illustrate Mississauga's place in confederation.

The Living Arts Center received a grant to support year long activities including a family day and a special event on Canada Day.

The Mississauga Pops received a grant to create a showcase of Mississauga/ Canadian music from the '60s through to the present.

A grant to First United Church will help bring the Port Credit community and organizations together to enhance Canada Day celebrations and public events.
